Manual flash mode uses fractions. You can either have your flash on full power, or have

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it fire at just a fraction of its capabilities. The 1/2 setting on manual flash mode is simply 1/2 the power of the full flash. What begins to get tricky is that digital cameras don't have a built in flash meter.

Manual mode is where you take control of the power output of the

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flash and therefore get more consistently lit photos. For example, if you are in one spot photographing a portrait and don't need to adjust for ambient light changes constantly, then you can set your flash at 1/4 power and leave it there until you move or want something different.

The specifications will also show the flash settings at which the guide number is calculated, including the ISO and flash zoom setting. I use the cheap Godox units. They have a guide number of 60 meters, calculated at ISO100 and a full flash zoom setting of 200mm.

Dial down your camera settings to reduce hot spots in the background, and dial down flash power for hot spots on your subject. Note - The Inverse Square Law and Flash Photography It is worth noting the inverse square rule with flash at this point in relation to the distance between your

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subject and the background.

If we were to shoot in TTL flash exposure, then the distance we'd read for full manual power (1/1 setting), would be the maximum range for which we'd be able to get correct TTL exposure. You can see this for yourself by

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flipping between TTL mode and full manual power. The top value for or distance should remain the same.

Practical tutorial: Controls for manual flash exposure ...

In the case of manual flash, there is NO control by the flashgun or camera, over the intensity or duration of the pulse of light from the flash unit. This is manual flash.

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Photographers can control the output of their flashguns by adjusting the settings in fractions of the maximum possible output, eg, $\frac{1}{4}$ power, $\frac{1}{16}$ th power.
